



Don't Let Congress Throw Michigan To The Wolves!

In 1992, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service established population goals of 100 wolves in Michigan and Wisconsin to determine the population recovered and able to be removed from the Federally Endangered list.

That goal of 100 wolves was met in 1994 and has steadily climbed above 100 every year since. Currently, **Michigan's wolf population is more than 1200% above** the required levels for delisting.
